GARDENVALE Primary School students have been treated to a colourful performance about giving graffiti the brush-off.

The performance was part of the Bayside Council's Graffiti Awareness Education Program, which involves an actor visiting schools and showing students what can happen to someone involved in graffiti vandalism.

Bayside Youth Advisory Group member Councillor Terry O'Brien said 100 per cent of the municipality's primary and secondary schools were participating in the program.

"The students attending the program are given strategies to help them deal with peer pressure, and to encourage them to look for more rewarding activities with their mates," Cr O'Brien said.
